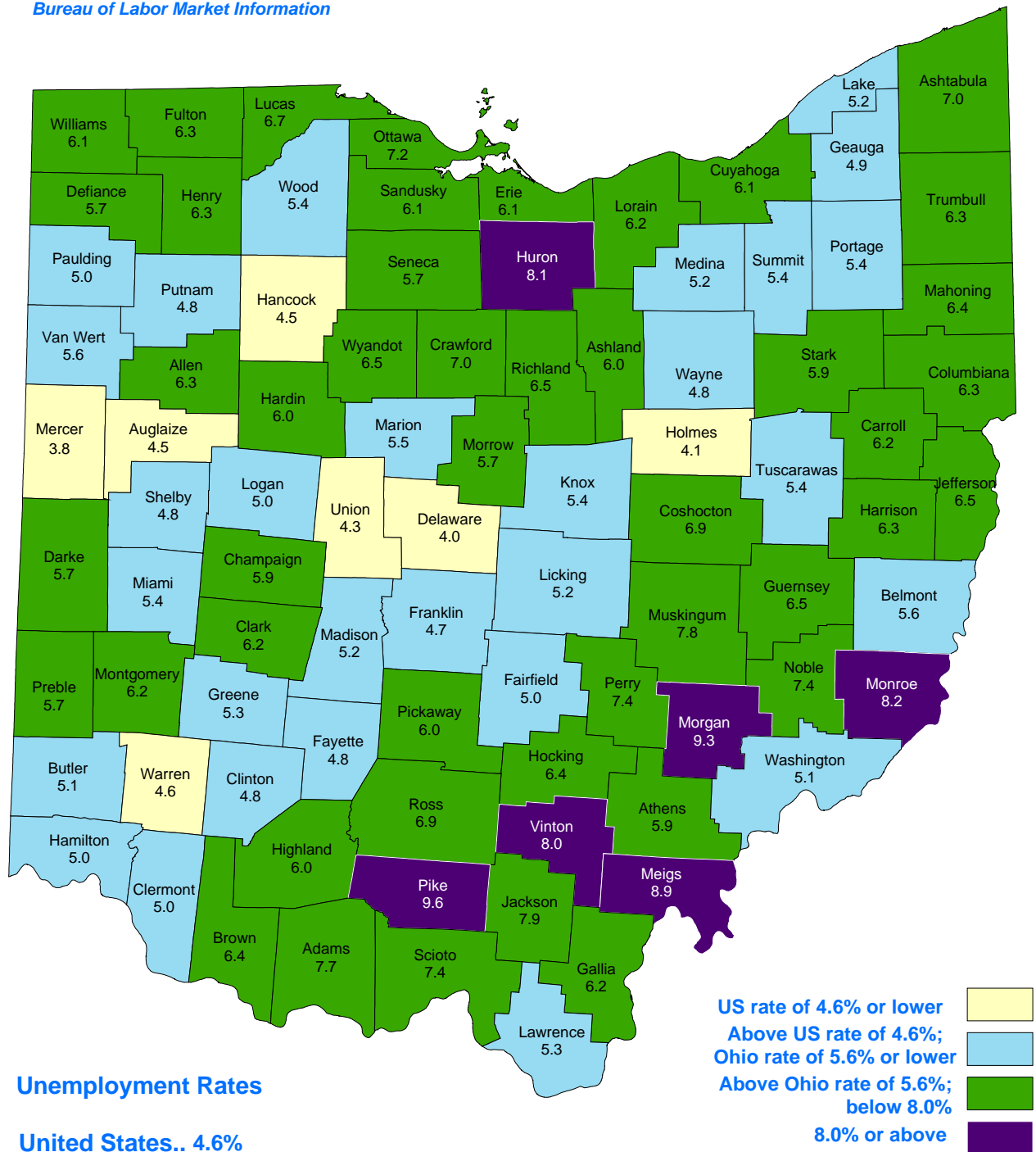

Employment includes workers involved in labor-management disputes. [c] Rate equals unrounded unemployment divided by unrounded labor force.
