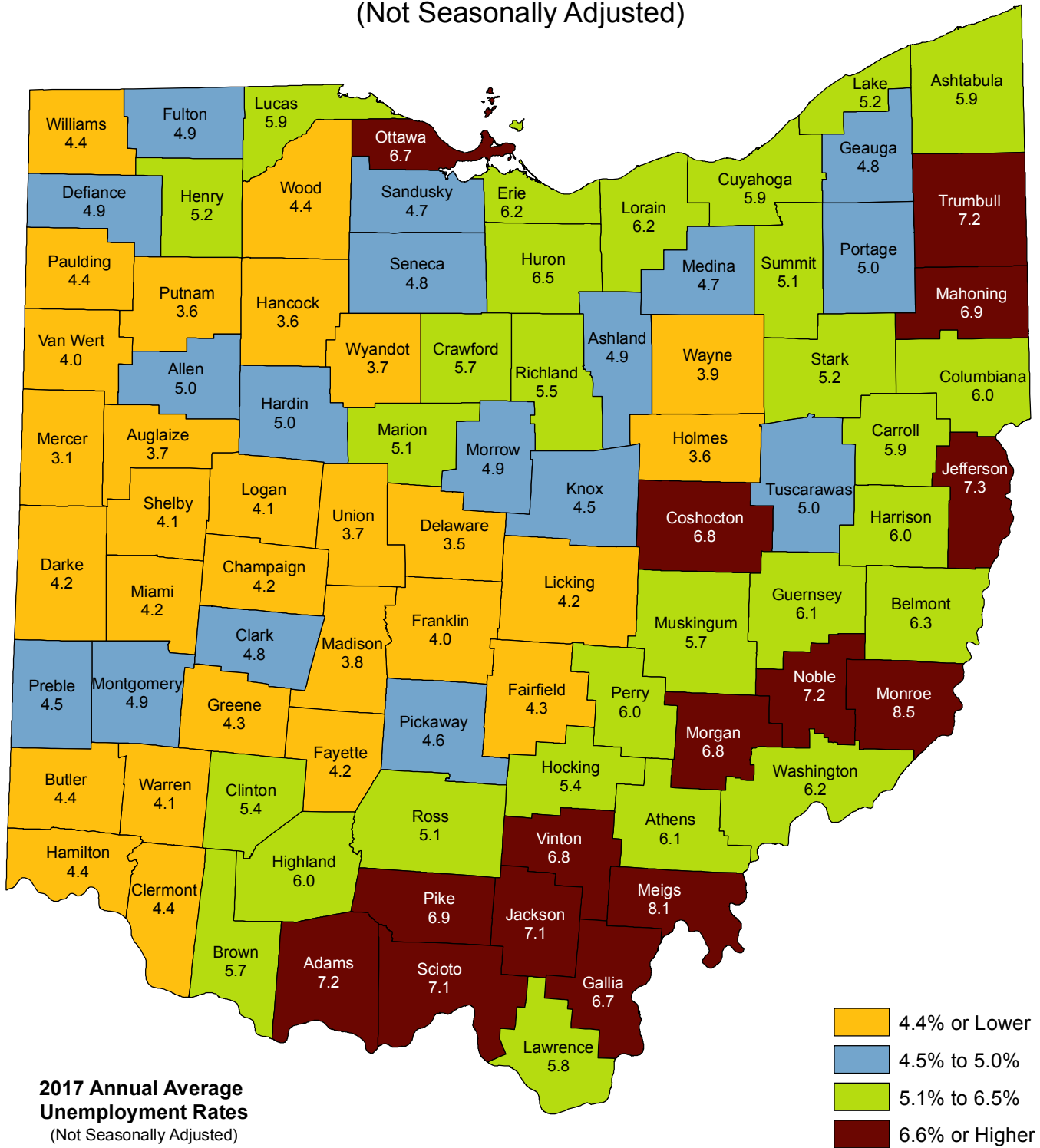
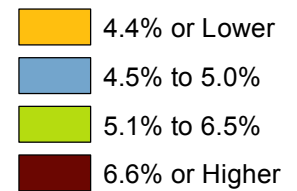


Ohio Unemployment Rates 2017 Annual Average
