Mass Layoff Events in Ohio 4th Quarter 2011


During the period October through December 2011, there were 92 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 13 events from the 4th Quarter of 2010. This resulted in 13,095 separations, a decrease of 1,971 from the 4th Quarter 2010 total of 15,066 separations. Included in the 92 events were 2 establishment closures/partial closures of single or multiple worksites with 196 separations. This compares to 3 establishment closures and 470 separations from a year ago.

Events by Industry

Construction out paced all with 42% of the total number of mass layoff events and 42% of all separations. Manufacturing followed with 24% of the total events and represented 29% of all separations.




Events by Primary Reason
