

## Mass Layoff Events in Ohio

### First Quarter 2013

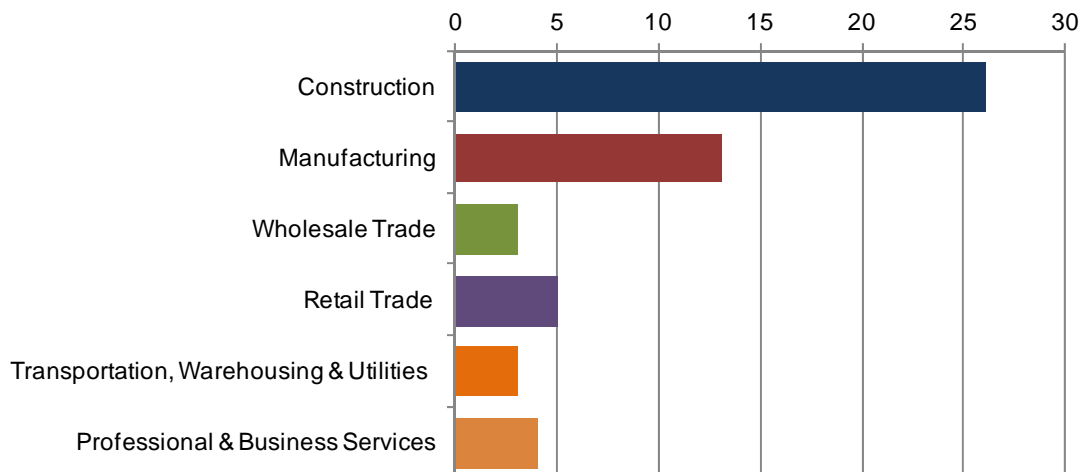
From January through March 2013, there were 55 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 7 events from the first quarter 2012; those events resulted in 6,173 separations, a decrease of 1,777 events from the first quarter 2012 (7,950 separations). Included in the 55 events were 4 establishment closures of single or multiple worksites with 678 separations. This compares to 4 establishment closures and 683 separations from a year ago.

#### Events by Industry

The construction industry outpaced all other industries with 47 percent of the mass layoff events and 42 percent of separations. Next was manufacturing with 24 percent of the events and 30 percent of separations. Retail trade accounted for 9 percent of events and 11 percent of separations.

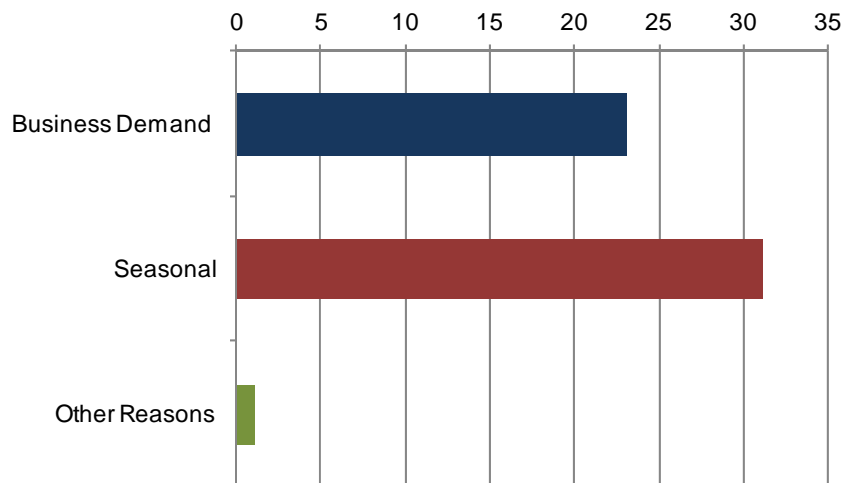


## Events by Primary Reason

Seasonal demand was responsible for 56 percent of the mass layoffs events and 54 percent of separations, while general business demand accounted for 42 percent of mass layoffs and 44 percent of all separations.
